

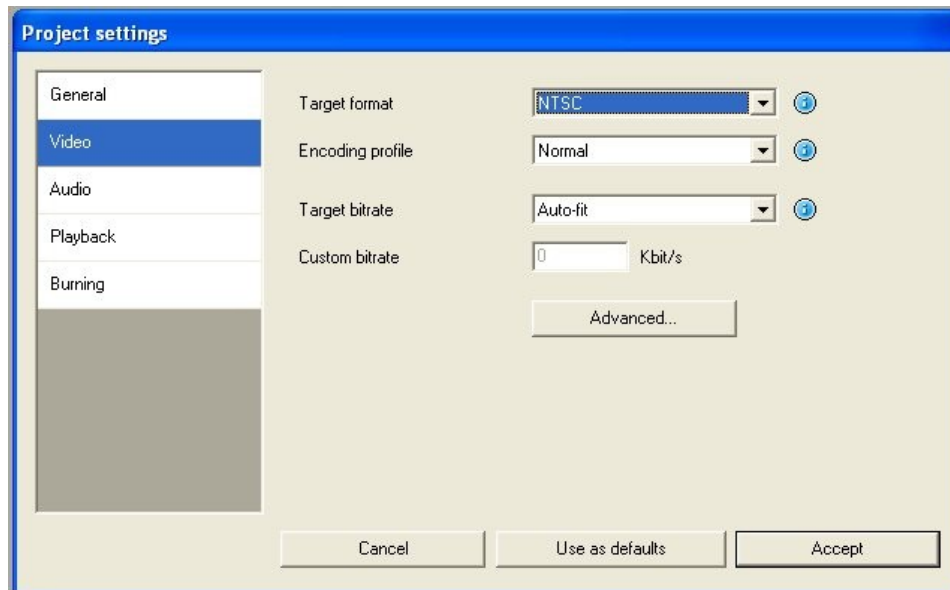
Making a DVD with DVD Flick



You can burn your own DVD using the program DVDFlick, which you can freely download from <http://www.dvdflick.net>.

To use the program simply download the program and install it on your PC.

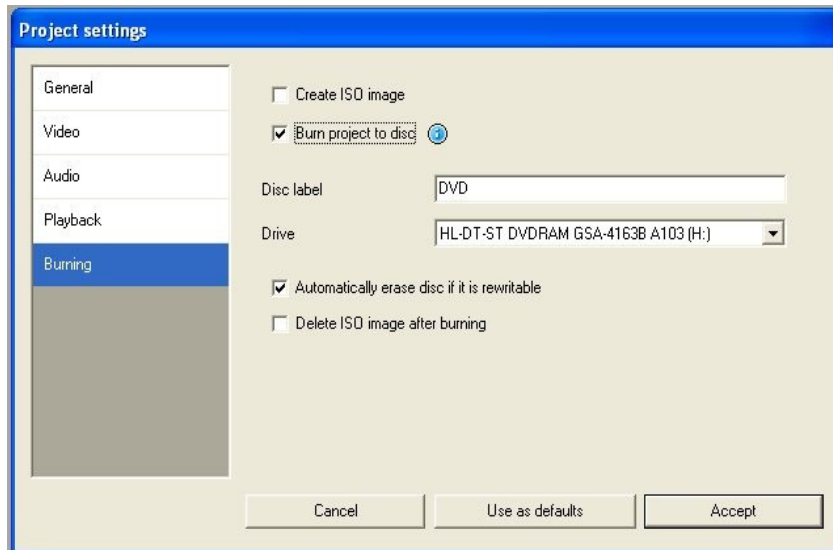
1. Select **“Project settings”** this will bring up a small window.
2. On the left of this window select the **“Video”** option. Most TV players in Australia play both PAL and NTSC. This means that if you have a newish TV then you should choose NTSC, the American system, as the Video was produced according to USA usage. If you have an old TV then choose PAL (for Australia or the UK).

3. On the left of this window select the **“Burning”** option and **tick the “Burn project to disk”** option (this is important to do because if you don't you will have to repeat the whole long process again).

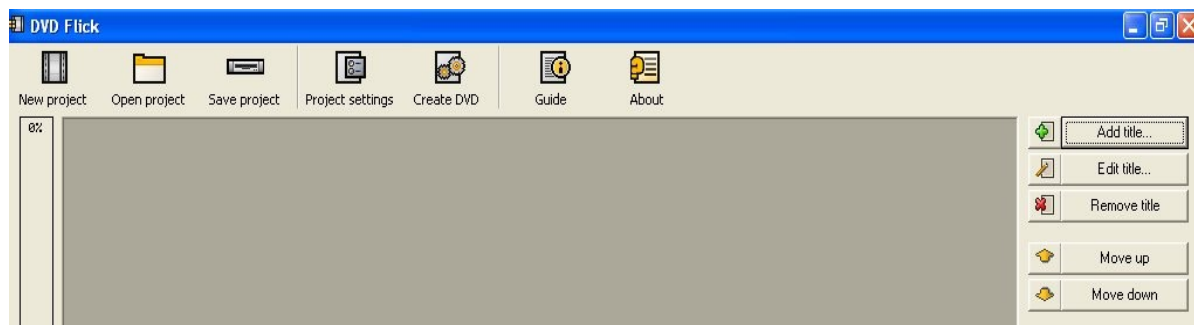
Ensure under the **“Drive”** you have the drive selected that you burn DVD with.



Enter a Name for the DVD you are about to create (**Disk Label**)

Now on the bottom right hand corner of the window select the **“Accept”** button, this will close that window and leaving just the original window open.

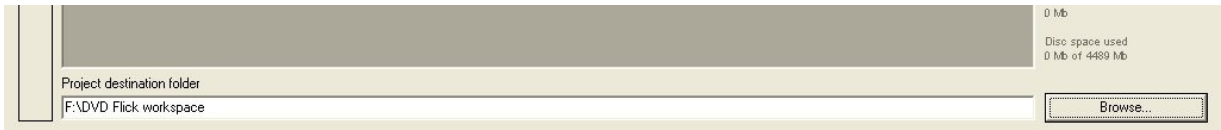
4. This Window is now visible



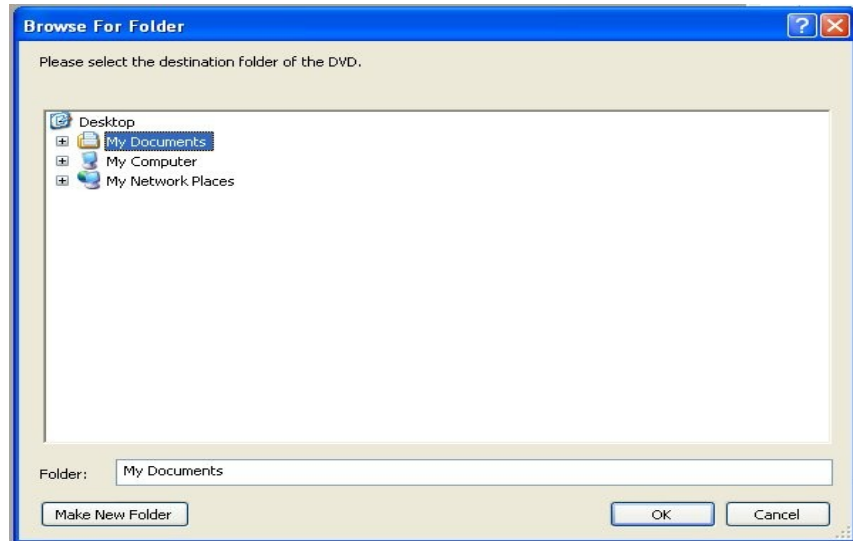
On the right hand side select the **“Add title”** button, select the downloaded video file from Oprah's site and press the **“Open”** button.

5. DVDFlick uses 9 Gig of space, so it is wise to have the program put its files where you want them, and have the space required. The bottom of this screen looks like this -

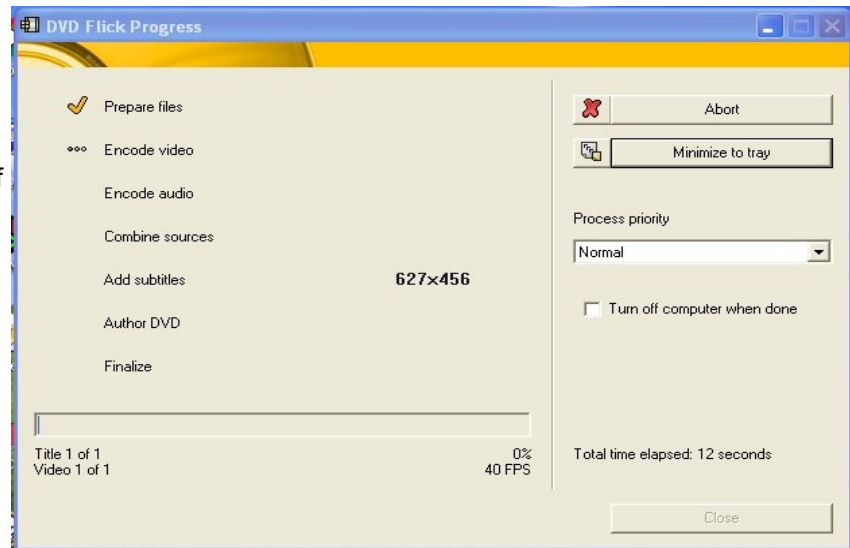


6. Click on **Browse** and this window appears



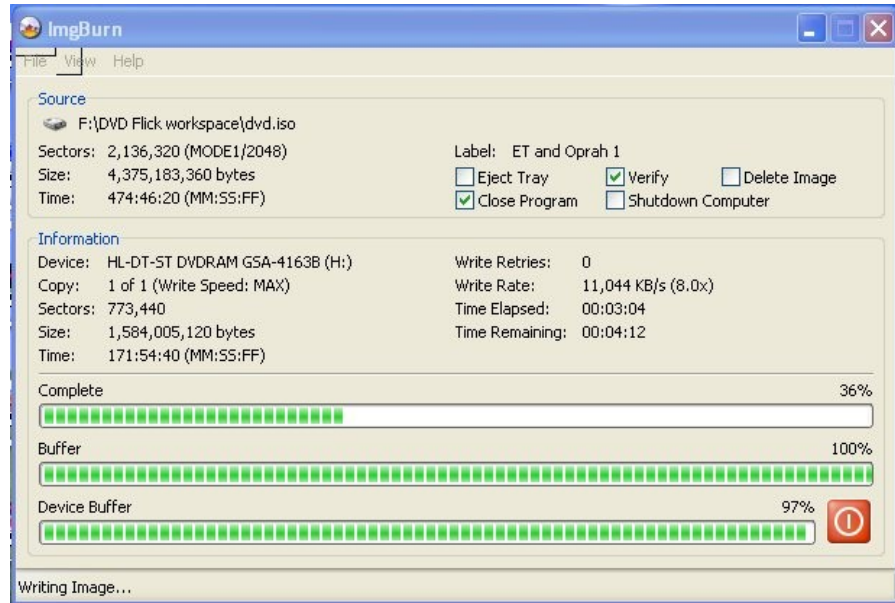
7. Navigate to where you have a folder on a drive with sufficient space and select that folder and then press OK. If you are not sure what all this means – just leave this bit out as it may not be an issue for you.

8. Insert a blank DVD in your drive and select the **“Create DVD”** from the top icons and off you go!

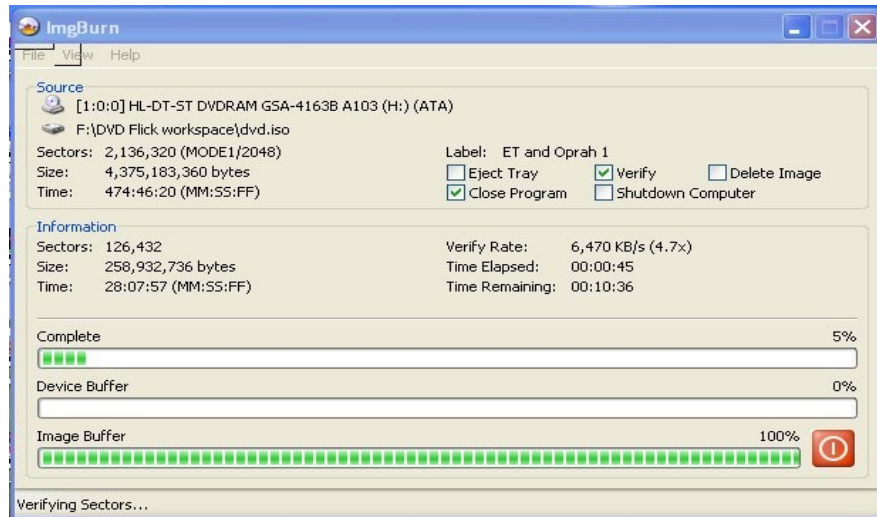


Making a DVD with DVD Flick

- When DVDFlick is ready to burn the DVD it automatically uses another program called **ImgBurn** do this – you can see here (bottom left) that **ImgBurn** is Writing the Image to the DVD



- When **ImgBurn** has burnt the DVD it then checks the DVD to make sure that it is all perfect – calling it “verifying”). Once again see the bottom left of the window “Verifying Sectors”



DVDFlick takes about 90 to 120 minutes to prepare the DVD for Burning. How long this takes will depend on the speed of your computer.

During the file creation process DVD Flick uses ALL of the power of the computer, so it is best to just let it get on with it – meaning – leave it alone.
